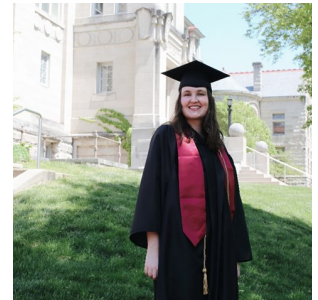

Brogan has a thoughtful approach to geography and he is a careful researcher. Brogan is also practical and has a get it done attitude, which is the best! Congratulations Brogan!

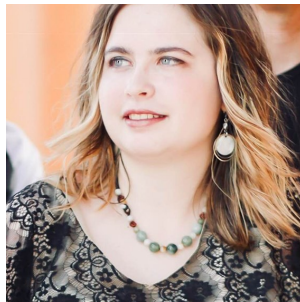
